Orally administered dryocrassin ABBA provides mice protection against avian influenza

virus H5N1 by inhibiting inflammation and reducing virus loads; dryocrassin ABBA is a

potential novel lead compound which has antiviral effects on amantadine-resistant avian

influenza virus H5N1 infection.[1]

Dryocrassin ABBA, a phloroglucinol derivative extracted from Dryopteris crassirhizoma,

it significantly suppresses tumor growth, without major side effects; suggests that it may

induce apoptosis in human hepatocellular carcinoma cells through a caspase-mediated

mitochondrial pathway.[2]
